Technician Report: Jason reported that Justin Vogel's renovation has been completed. Sent bill for balance due. Jason has given out a couple of tree renovation estimates, but most of the other estimates have resulted in complete removals and bigger projects than what the district does. Jason is working on tree plans, so far there is 30,000 ft of trees planned for planting with more to come for next year. The shed and equipment are cleaned up and put away for the year, but the drill and reel with pump are still available.

Watershed Report: Lori spoke on her attached report. The plot tours had a wonderful turn out with a lot of great information. See report.

OLD BUSINESS: Annual meeting in Bismarck, scheduled for Nov. 22-24th. Reservations have been made. Need to confirm who are attending. So far we have Lori, Amanda, Diane and Charlene. Bill has declined, Brad will let Jill know by the end of the month. Shelly will get back to Jill by the end of the week.

NEW BUSINESS: The pollinator park flower bed is falling apart due to the way it was originally constructed years ago. Jason and Jill have decided to demolish it with the intention of relocating and rebuilding it. The new smaller constructed flower bed will sturdier, enclosed completely and be located closer to and more visible from the highway.

The field office has been busy working on the following:

- Following up with contract holders on the progress of conservation practices being installed before freeze up and making payments on those completed.
- Developing Conservation Technical Assistance (CTA) plans with willing producers on resource concerns they have.
- Starting to contract Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) renewals. Five up for renewal in Barnes County.
- Damage Assessment Report (DAM): It was determined that no crops in Barnes County suffered greater than 30% loss in yield in 2015. See handout.

### **PROGRAMS:**

- Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) General Sign up:
  - o The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) will accept new offers to participate in CRP under a general signup to be held **Dec. 1, 2015, through Feb. 26, 2016.** Eligible existing program participants with contracts expiring Sept. 30, 2015, will be granted an option for one-year extensions. Farmers and ranchers interested in removing sensitive land from agricultural production and planting grasses or trees to reduce soil erosion, improve water quality and restore wildlife habitat are encouraged to enroll.
  - o **Continuous Conservation Reserve Program (CCRP):** waiting to hear on acres allocations for the new Fiscal Year. Planning is on hold until then.
- Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) Grasslands:
  - The 2014 Farm Bill created a new conservation program for the Farm Service Agency (FSA). CRP grasslands is a voluntary program where participants limit future development and cropping uses of the land while retaining the right to use common grazing practices and operations related to the production of forage and seed, subject to certain restrictions during the primary nesting season for birds in the local area that are economically significant, in significant decline or conserved according to the Federal or State law in consultation with the State Technical Committee.

- o The signup began on September 1<sup>st</sup> and will end on November 20<sup>th</sup> 2015. Eligible offers will be evaluated in designated batching periods and Barnes County has a rate of \$18/ac. 1 application on file at FSA.
- Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP):
  - o Local Work Group (LWG) & State Funding pools: **Sign up deadline October 16**<sup>th</sup> **2015- THIS FRIDAY**. We currently have 18 applications on file.
  - o Local Work Group (LWG), Multi-County meeting: **Tuesday October 20**th in Jamestown at the Farmers Union building at 9 a.m. One representative from the Barnes County SCD board needs to attend with me.
- Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP):
  - o Renewals: Due to Program Liaison by November 13th 2015.
- Wetland Reserve Easement (WRE):
  - o Sign up deadline is November 20<sup>th</sup> 2015. We currently have 14 applications on file.
