

The Board of Barnes County Commissioners met in regular session Tuesday, May 3, 2005, with all members present.

Kerry Johnson, Highway Superintendent, and Charlotte Brett of Kadrmas, Lee & Jackson, met with the Commission. Brett provided an update on the 4th St. Bridge Project.

Johnson reported on the engineering conference he attended in Bismarck. He also presented copies of the poster advertising the County Auction, which will be held May 12 at 10:30 a.m. at the Highway Department.

Johnson discussed the problems at the State Highway Department with the Highway-Byway sign. He recommended replacing the "Yield" signs along the Kathryn Road with "Stop" signs. It was the consensus of the Board that Johnson proceeds with that recommendation, while the Highway-Byway sign issue will continue to be studied.

Johnson informed the Commission that he has filled the vacated Equipment II Operator position with the hiring of Dick Korf.

Commissioner Triebold made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Opdahl, to approve the meeting minutes of April 19, 2005. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Tom Goven, Barnes County Indigent Defense Attorney, requested the Commission allow payment to Attorney Thomas Merrick of Jamestown out of Conflict of Interest budgeted funds, stemming from services Merrick provided to Barnes County because of a death in Goven's family.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Maasjo, to allow the bill of \$127.50 to Merrick to be paid out of the Conflict funds as requested. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Maasjo made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Opdahl, to allow the Clerk of Court's office to make Tanya Meisch a deputy clerk. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

County Auditor Ed McGough presented a letter from the North Dakota Public Employees Retirement System (NDPERS) program requesting the Commission appoint a Wellness Coordinator and join the PERS Wellness in the Workplace program, which would reduce County health premiums by 1 percent from July 1, 2005, through June 30, 2006.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Maasjo, to be a part of the NDPERS Wellness in the Workplace program, to receive the 1 percent discount on health premiums. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Maasjo made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Opdahl, to add the following Weed Board Policy to the Barnes County Policy Manual. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Policy for Weed Board Employees - 2005

1. All employees will wear personal protective equipment according to the label of the chemical being applied.
2. When operating an ATV, a helmet will be worn always, no exceptions.
3. Employees will receive two written warnings; on the third offense, they will be dismissed.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to allow the Faith in Action agency to conduct the annual Street Festival on the Courthouse Square, and the Valley Quilters to hold their quilt show inside the Courthouse, with both events set for August 6, 2005. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

The Commission congratulated Social Services on their recent state recognition to the Eligibility Staff, who received the Conrad J. Moe Award and the Star Award, both given for having low error rates.

Discussion took place concerning mileage.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to raise mileage reimbursement county-wide, to .375 per mile, starting May 4, 2005. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Maasjo updated the Commission on the construction being done in Social Services offices. Social Services have requested the addition of walls to comply with HIPAA regulations. Commissioner Maasjo will study the matter further for a future Commission meeting.

Tax Director BJ Edwardson met with the Commission to present tax abatement requests.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to approve the abatement request on PCL: 41-4150800 (Jeffrey A. Gilbertson, Valley City) for 2004 as presented and recommended by the Valley Township Board. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Maasjo made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Schwehr, to approve the abatement request on PCL: 57-9000100 (Gorder Grain Inc., Butte, ND, d/b/a Pillsbury Elevator) for 2003 and 2004 as presented and recommended by the City of Pillsbury. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Maasjo made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to approve the abatement request on PCL: 41-4130202 (Eugene R. and Edith E. Johnson, Valley City) for 2004, as presented and recommended by the Valley Township Board. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to approve the abatement request on PCL: 01-1610110 (LeRoy Triebold, Valley City) as presented and recommended by the Alta Township Board. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Maasjo made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Opdahl, to follow the recommendation of the Ashtabula Township Board to deny the abatement request on PCL: 03-6450080 (Roger and Rochelle Triebold, Valley City) for 2004, as presented. Brad Cruff, Attorney for the Triebolds, stated that the contiguous question has been satisfied with the Triebold ownership of Lot 8. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," except Commissioner Triebold, who voted "no," motion carried.

Harold Rotunda, County CPA, presented the County Audit Report. He informed the Commission that :

- Barnes County is not responsible for City-County Health, that City-County Health is a separate entity responsible for itself.
- It is not against the law to spend in the red, but it is against the law to overspend a budget.

It was the consensus of the Board that Rotunda finalizes the audit with City-County Health in the red. The County Commission will watch the CCH 2005 budget closely, and if need be, they would be willing to lend them another \$27,000, with the intention of payback.

Bernie Wagner of the Veterans Service Officer selection committee met with the Commission to recommend candidate James Verwey for the position.

Commissioner Triebold made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Opdahl, to appoint James Verwey as the Barnes County Veteran Service Officer, to start as soon as possible.

Commissioner Maasjo gave a report on progress at the parks.
