

The Board of Barnes County Commissioners met in regular session Tuesday, June 7, 2005, with all members present.

Kerry Johnson, Highway Superintendent, and Bob Podoll of Kadrmass, Lee & Jackson met with the Commission. Podoll updated the Commission as to ongoing projects in the County.

Johnson discussed how the rains have affected County roads. He also discussed a motor problem in one of the loaders. It was the consensus of the Board that, in case of emergency, Johnson should rent a loader.

Johnson also discussed a replacement for Lois Bjornson, who has retired.

Commissioner Opdahl made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to have the Compensation Committee create a job description for a Highway Department Secretary/Zoning Coordinator/ Water Board Secretary position at 30 hours per week. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Maasjo made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Opdahl, to approve the minutes of May 17 and 20, and May 24, with a correction. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to relieve Emergency Manager Norma Duppler of her responsibilities as Zoning Coordinator, until such time as the responsibility has been transferred to a new position. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Triebold made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Maasjo, to appoint Nyle Burchill to the School Annexation, Reorganization, and Dissolution Committee. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Maasjo made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to approve gaming site authorization for the Enderlin Alumni Association at the Roadside Bar and Grill. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Tax Director BJ Edwardson presented an abatement request on three parcels for Stephen Matthews of Sanborn. Matthews was present to discuss the abatements, along with Assessor Scott Legge and City Auditor Bob Podoll. Matthews agreed the first two parcels were okay the way they are.

The parcels included the following (all in Barnums Addition to Sanborn):

- 1) PCL: 59-0100520, Lots 9-14, Blk 6, Request from \$3600 to \$1600;
- 2) PCL: 59-0100670, Lots 5-8, Blk 7, Request from \$1600 to \$400;
- 3) PCL: 59-0100730, Lots 16-20, Blk 7, Request from \$200 to \$500.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to grant the abatement request on Parcel 3, and to deny the others. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to increase agricultural land valuations across the board by 4 percent as required by SB 2188, from average price per acre of \$346.94 certified at county equalization, to average price per acre of \$378.68 to reach tolerance of revised state certified average per acre. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Harold Rotunda, CPA, presented the final county audit for FY 2004. An audit of the Recorder's Office was discussed. Rotunda will complete the audit as soon as possible.

Bob Drake, representing the Committee for Community Involvement, and Attorney Dan Buchanan met with the Commission to request a continuance of the tax equalization meeting for a period of 45 days, to give the Committee a chance to provide and discuss information on the results of Valley City's Vanguard appraisal project. Buchanan pointed out some inadequacies in the property valuations. Committee member Jay Cink suggested that the continuance could apply only to Valley City. City Attorney Brad Cruff asked the Committee to explain what they would do with the continuance, the answer being that they would collect more information for discussion. Cink said the City Commission was stonewalling.

City Assessor Dave Ramstad stated he has worked closely with Vanguard, that there had been no stonewalling, that meetings had been publicized and held, and that information was available in the newspaper and on the Internet for taxpayers to do comparisons.

Tax Director BJ Edwardson stated her concerns about the time frame for collecting information for State Equalization if the continuance were granted.

Chairman Berntson called for a motion to approve the requested continuance. No motion was made.

Chairman Berntson recessed the meeting and opened the County Equalization hearing at 1 p.m. He then called the roll of cities. The following changes were presented to the Commission:

1. Dazey- Increase city valuation from 3.6 percent to 6 percent as instructed by the Tax Director. No motion was made to increase above the 3.6 percent.
2. Pillsbury- No action needed; taxes taken care of prior to the Equalization Hearing.
3. Rogers- City Assessor Mary Engle stated reasons they did not increase city valuations. Edwardson stated Rogers needs to be increased to 9 percent to bring them to the 6 percent increase. No motion was made to increase the City of Rogers.
4. Sanborn- Scott Legge, Sanborn assessor, stated since there was no motion to increase Dazey and Rogers, Sanborn would take the decrease if they could. No motion was made to decrease valuation in Sanborn.

Commissioner Opdahl made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to approve the value decrease from \$2,000.00 to \$500.00 on PCL:59-0100730, as per abatement hearing held earlier.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to deny McLain's request for exemption from property taxes. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Chairman Berntson then re-opened the Equalization Hearing. Discussion followed concerning the City of Valley City.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Maasjo, that the County Equalization Board is to reconvene Friday, June 10, 2005, at 8 a.m., to make a decision on the Valley City property assessment after hearing back from the City Assessor on issues concerning the property owners who appealed the City assessments to the County. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Chairman Berntson closed the Barnes County Equalization Hearing.
