

The Barnes County Commission met in regular session Tuesday, June 6, 2006, with all members present.

Chairman Opdahl appointed Commissioner Triebold as a County Commission representative on the Canvassing Board in his place due to possible conflict of interest, as Opdahl is on the ballot.

Kerry Johnson, Highway Superintendent, discussed donation dollars he's received for park improvements.

Barry Schuchard, Kadrmas, Lee & Jackson, discussed state funding for the 4th St. Bridge replacement project.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Maasjo, to have the Chairman sign the design agreement pertaining to the 4th St. Bridge Project with the ND Department of Transportation when it arrives. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Johnson discussed a letter he received concerning installation of railroad crossing signs on a township road.

The minutes of the May 16 meeting were approved as presented.

Commissioner Maasjo made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Schwehr, to approve an event alcoholic beverage permit (one day) retroactive to May 26 for the Lodge and Peanut Bar. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes" except Commissioner Berntson, who voted "no," motion carried.

Commissioner Berntson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to approve gaming site authorization at the Roadside Bar & Grill in Enderlin, for the Enderlin Alumni Association. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Maasjo, to approve gaming site authorization at Kelly's Crossing for the VFW, and at the Lodge and Peanut Bar for the Jamestown Knights of Columbus. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Berntson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to pay the Stutsman County Auditor \$5,000.00 for the service of the Stutsman County Task Force officer assigned to work in Barnes County for 2006 only. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Berntson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Triebold, to nominate Dale Maasjo to the Executive Board of the South Central Dakota Regional Council. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes" motion carried.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Maasjo, to sign the amended Joint Powers Agreement and the following Joint Resolution that Barnes County be a partner to the Sheyenne Valley Correctional Center. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes" motion carried.

It is hereby resolved by the City of Valley City, Barnes County, Dickey County, Griggs County, LaMoure County, Ransom County, Sargent County and Steele County as follows:

That the City of Valley City, Barnes County, Dickey County, Griggs County, LaMoure County, Ransom County, Sargent County and Steele County intend to enter into a Joint Powers Agreement which will, in substance, clarify that the City of Valley City, Barnes County, Dickey County, Griggs County, LaMoure County, Ransom County, Sargent County and Steele County will form a political partnership for the planning, construction, financing and maintaining of a multi-jurisdictional correctional facility at Valley City, North Dakota.

Nyle Burchill met with the Commission to express concern that the new Keystone Pipeline coming through Barnes County has been re-routed further west than first proposed and is now too close to the Sheyenne River. He urged the Commission to ask the pipeline company to use their original planned route.

Commissioner Schwehr made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Berntson, to appoint Judy Legge to the Valley City-Barnes County Public Library Board for a three-year term starting in July, 2006. She replaces Liz Johnson. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Maasjo made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Schwehr, to re-appoint Dr. Gerald Norberg and Jack Formo to a three-year term representing the 4th District on the School Annexation, Reorganization and Dissolution Committee.
