

The Barnes County Commission met in regular session Tuesday, June 3, 2008, with all members present.

The Commission heard a presentation on the pork industry by Jim Tilton of the Pork Association.

Chairperson Schwehr then recessed the Commission meeting, and Dale Maasjo, Park Board Chairman, opened a meeting of the Park Board. In attendance were Bev Anderson, Kerry Anderson, and Tim Tangen.

Mr. Maasjo informed the Commission that the new dock is installed. Mr. Johnson stated that the cost of garbage has increased from \$60 to \$90.

Discussion was held concerning the possibility of purchasing a building for a shower at Clausen Springs.

Commissioner Opdahl made a motion, seconded by Weber, to look for a new or used building for a shower at Clausen Springs, and to include miscellaneous costs to complete the project. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Park Board, Commissioner Triebold made a motion, seconded by Weber, to adjourn. Motion carried.

Chairperson Schwehr re-opened the Commission meeting.

Commissioner Weber made a motion, seconded by Berntson, to approve the minutes of May 20, with a clarification. Motion carried.

Brad Cruff, States Attorney, met with the Commission to discuss building permit fees on wind towers.

Commissioner Opdahl made a motion, seconded by Berntson, that a building permit fee of one-tenth of one percent of the total project valuation of the project be recommended to the Planning and Zoning Board. Upon a roll call vote with all members voting "yes," except Commissioner Triebold, who voted "no," motion carried.

Katie Hajicek, Family Nutrition Program coordinator, met with the Commission to outline the FNP proposal.

Commissioner Triebold made a motion, seconded by Opdahl, to allow Chairperson Schwehr to sign the Family Nutrition Program proposal as presented. Motion carried.

Kerry Johnson, Highway Superintendent, and Brad Cruff were present to conduct bid opening for a motor grader, with the following bids received: Butler, Fargo, \$221,561.00; Sweeney Brothers of Fargo, \$177,566.00; RDO John Deere, Moorhead, \$197,500.00; and Titan Case, Fargo, \$183,500.00.

Mr. Johnson informed the vendors present that a decision on the bids will be made June 17 at 8:30 a.m.

Heather Pautz, Social Services Director, and area funeral directors met with the Commission to request an increase for county burial costs, from \$3,108.00 to 3,445.10 for the remainder of 2008, and then increase to \$3,629.
