

The Barnes County Commission met in regular session Tuesday, June 1, 2010, with all members present.

Kerry Johnson, Highway Superintendent, and Mark Anderson of KLJ met with the Commission. Mr. Johnson informed the Commission that Eckelson Lake has risen significantly and is flowing out on its own. He also reported on roads closed due to water running over them, and on bad culverts.

Commissioner Berntson made a motion, seconded by Froelich, to approve bidding for an emergency grade raise on County Road 22, east and west of State Highway 1, to protect the roadway. Upon a roll call vote with all voting "yes," motion carried.

Discussion took place about combining the open zoning coordinator position with the part-time administrative assistant position in the Tax Equalization Office.

Commissioner Opdahl made a motion, seconded by Froelich, to approve moving the zoning position into the office of Tax Equalization, with the Tax Director being the Zoning Coordinator, changing the position of the part-time administrative assistant to full-time, and setting the grade at 7, with a starting salary of \$11.64, effective at the next pay period.

Commissioner Opdahl made a motion, seconded by Weber, to approve the management plan for Barnes County to purchase the FEMA buyouts. Upon a roll call vote with all voting "yes," motion carried.

Commissioner Opdahl made a motion, seconded by Weber, to reappoint Gregory Dimmer to the Barnes County School Annexation, Reorganization and Dissolution Board. Upon a roll call vote with all voting "yes," motion carried.

Eldred Knutson, Planning and Zoning Chairman, discussed the penalty fine assessed to a company that started building without a building permit, and on other parts of the zoning code that are not being followed. It was the consensus of the Board that Mr. Knutson work with the States Attorney, and that the Commission is fully behind him in enforcing the Barnes County Zoning Code.

Heather Pautz, Social Service Director, met with the Commission to discuss a summer hours schedule consisting of rotation within the department of 4-day weeks to ensure all offices are open 5 days per week.

Commissioner Froelich made a motion, seconded by Opdahl, to approve the summer hours and rotation of employees to allow them a 4-day work week, with all offices to be open Monday through Friday, and that the Commission is informed of which departments are involved in the rotation. The program is to be effective May 31 through September 1. Upon a roll call vote with all voting "yes," motion carried.

Theresa Will, CCHD Director, updated the Commission on programs and upcoming meetings, and reported that their budgets are doing well.

Commissioner Froelich made a motion, seconded by Opdahl, to have Kim Franklin, Emergency Manager, form a committee to develop an emergency plan for disasters. Upon a roll call vote with all voting "yes," motion carried.

With no further discussion before the Board, Commissioner Froelich made a motion, seconded by Opdahl, to adjourn the equalization hearing. Motion carried.

Chairperson Schwehr reconvened the Commission meeting.

Discussion was held concerning recommendation for **#05-2840400, Betty Gibbons**, to add residential structure, and parcel valuation change from \$62,200 to \$136,000 (OM). Ms. Gibbons informed the Commission that the house is more than 100 years old and believes the valuation should be reduced to \$45,000.

Commissioner Froelich made a motion, seconded by Berntson, to approve Koslofsky's recommendation of \$136,000. Upon a roll call vote with all voting "yes" except Weber, who voted "no," motion carried.

Koslofsky also informed the Commission that the farm residence exemption of Harlan Opdahl was approved. Mr. Opdahl met the requirements by providing proof of retirement date and 3 previous years of income tax returns. These documents were received and it was determined that Mr. Opdahl does qualify for the farm residence exemption.

The following cities included omitted assessments: Pillsbury and Wimbledon and the following townships: Anderson, Getchell, Green, Hemen, Hobart, Rogers, Sibley Trail, Svea, and Valley.

Commissioner Berntson made a motion, seconded by Weber, to approve the omitted assessments on those properties as recommended by Koslofsky. Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Commissioner Opdahl made a motion, seconded by Weber, to adjourn. Motion carried.
