- Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) General Sign up Coming:
 - o The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) will accept new offers to participate in CRP under a general signup to be held Dec. 1, 2015, through Feb. 26, 2016. Eligible existing program participants with contracts expiring Sept. 30, 2015, will be granted an option for one-year extensions. Farmers and ranchers interested in removing sensitive land from agricultural production and planting grasses or trees to reduce soil erosion, improve water quality and restore wildlife habitat are encouraged to enroll.
- Environmental quality Incentives Program (EQIP):
 - o 2016 sign up is usually in the fall (October/November).
- Kathryn- Salinity Plots are looking good in certain areas of the field. Possible field day coming up in September.
