The field office has been busy working on the following:

- Checking out and submitting payments for completed conservation practices in EQIP and WRP contracts. Completing modifications if needed. Calling contract holders to check on how things are going.
- Determining Continuous CRP eligibility and developing plans, maps and seed sheets (if needed). 29 conservation plans (on 961.46 acres) have been written for Continuous CRP in the last month.

PROGRAMS:

- Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) General Sign up Coming:
 - o The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) will accept new offers to participate in CRP under a general signup to be held **Dec. 1, 2015, through Feb. 26, 2016.** Eligible existing program participants with contracts expiring Sept. 30, 2015, will be granted an option for one-year extensions. Farmers and ranchers interested in removing sensitive land from agricultural production and planting grasses or trees to reduce soil erosion, improve water quality and restore wildlife habitat are encouraged to enroll.
- Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) Grasslands.
 - o The 2014 Farm Bill created a new conservation program for the Farm Service Agency (FSA). It is the CRP Grasslands Program, which basically replaces the existing Grassland Reserve Program (GRP). CRP grasslands is a voluntary program where participants limit future development and cropping uses of the land while retaining the right to use common grazing practices and operations related to the production of forage and seed, subject to certain restrictions during the primary nesting season for birds in the local area that are economically significant, in significant decline or conserved according to the Federal or State law in consultation with the State Technical Committee. The signup began on September 1st and will end on November 20th 2015. Eligible offers will be evaluated in designated batching periods. For more information ask the FSA office!
